Community

Delaware is a growing college town of approximately 43,000 located 30 miles north of Columbus, Ohio. The residents span all socioeconomic levels, and it is the home of Ohio Wesleyan University as well as several large industries. Currently, Delaware County is one of the fastest growing counties in the United States.

School District

The Delaware City School District is a mid-size city school system covering 36 square miles of land. The district enrolled approximately 6,209 students as of August 2023. The district serves students in eight school facilities: five Grades Pre-K-5 buildings, a Grades 6-8 middle school, and a comprehensive Grades 9-12 high school. Other district facilities include a curriculum and administration building, housing an online alternative education program; and transportation center.



High School

Rutherford B. Hayes High School is a four-year, public school with a total enrollment of over 1,760 and a 2024 graduation class of 436. The school is fully accredited by the State of Ohio Department of Education.










Graduation Requirements



Grading System

All courses are figured in computing a weighted Grade Point Average, except courses taken Pass/Fail or at the middle school level, on a 4.0 grading scale. Students taking Advanced Placement and College Credit Plus classes are given an extra 1.0 point additional weight while Honors courses receive o.5 additional weight. Class rank includes all students in each grade level. Rank and GPA are calculated at the end of each semester and are released to college admissions personnel with each transcript. All grades and courses for transfer students are included in accumulative GPA and rank. Valedictorian and salutatorian titles are not awarded. Summa Cum Laude is awarded to students with a 4.0+ GPA's, Magna Cum Laude is awarded to students with 3.75 - 3.99 GPA's, and Cum Laude is awarded to students with 3.5 - 3.74 GPA's.

College Credit Plus (CCP)

The state-sponsored dual enrollment option is available to all students who meet the requirements of respective post-secondary institutions. In 2022-23, 203 students participated in CCP, earning 1,412 college credit hours. Impacts of COVID-19


For the 2020-21 school year, our families had the choice to send students to school in a hybrid learning model or in a completely virtual Online Academy. Students who attended in the hybrid model were placed into two different

cohorts and attended school alternating between 2 days one week and 3 days in the following week. Our school did move to remote learning from Thanksgiving to Winter Break in 2020. Semester and final exams were cancelled. In the 2021-22 school year, our school returned to in-person learning and is no longer offering an Online Academy option.

Mastery Learning

Several of the courses in our high school are taught utilizing mastery learning in which students are able to continuously review course concepts and demonstrate they have mastered the content. As such, these courses do not issue letter grades until the course is completed. English 9, English 10 (& Honors), Algebra 1A/1B/1/2, Geometry, Modern World History (& Honors), United States History (& Honors), American Government & Economics, Physical Science, Biology (& Honors) all utilize mastery-based learning.

House System

Our high school personalizes the educational experience of students by placing students into one of eight Houses - Fairview, Fulton Creek, Houk, Lockport, Prospect Hill, Ridge, Steamtown, & Sugar Grove, which are named after the eight one-room

school houses still standing in Delaware County, OH. Within their House, students receive one-on-one assistance from teachers, participate in club activities, and compete in various competitions throughout the year, including the coveted House Games.

Athletics

Our high school offers 28 varsity sports, including Football & Basketball Cheerleading, Boys & Girls Cross Country, Football, Boys & Girls Golf, Boys & Girls Soccer, Boys & Girls Tennis, Boys & Girls Volleyball, Boys & Girls Basketball, Boys & Girls Bowling, Girls Gymnastics, Boys & Girls Swimming & Diving, Boys & Girls Wrestling, Baseball, Softball, Boys & Girls Track & Field, and Boys & Girls Lacrosse.
