


AFTER COVID-19 EXPOSURE GUIDELINES

This flow chart can help guide public health restriction decisions after a person is exposed to someone with COVID-19.¹

Did you have contact with a COVID-19 case?



Not a contact, however exposed person is recommended to:

- Wear a mask indoors for 10 days after exposure.
- Monitor for symptoms for 10 days after exposure.
- If symptoms develop, isolate at home for at least 5 days from symptom onset date and wear a mask for an additional 5 days.
- Consider testing for COVID-19 5 days after exposure.


Does the school have **ALL** of the following in place?

1. **Masking** for students and staff⁴ (regardless of vaccination status)
2. Strategies to **maximize physical distancing** (at least 3 feet between desks)
3. Documented **COVID-19 prevention policies** and procedures (identification of individuals experiencing symptoms, strategies for increase ventilation, protocols for cleaning, etc.)



Contacts are required to:

- **Quarantine at home for 10 days OR Quarantine at home for 5 days and wear a mask for an additional 5 days OR Wear a mask for 10 days if unable to quarantine.**
- **Monitor for symptoms for 10 days.**
- **If symptoms develop, isolate at home for at least 5 days from symptom onset date and wear a mask for an additional 5 days.**
- **Public health restrictions can be reduced to 7 days from last exposure if the individual has a negative viral test at least 5 days after exposure. Test must be taken or proctored by a healthcare provider.**
- **Household contacts may have longer public health restrictions based on their continuous exposure to case. See [Contact Considerations](#) for more guidance.**



1 This flow chart is a guide to help identify contacts. Some situations may deviate from the flowchart. (e.g. prolonged exposure in an enclosed environment, household settings).

2. Vaccinated and boosted is defined as individuals 12 years and older that have received 2 doses of Pfizer or Moderna or 1 dose of J & J and one booster dose of one of the three vaccine options.

3. A classroom setting does not include exposure in the community, sports, or extracurricular activities.

4. Students and staff who do not wear a mask during exposure will be required to follow public health restrictions.
